I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 2nd instent, enclosing a communication from the Principal of the Alberni Boarding School and etatements from Mesars. Hellier and Rinne of Ucluslet, with reference to the question of granting the discharge of papil No. 063, Jessie Klahouta.

In reply I beg to say it is considered that the principal who has hed this girl under his charge for a period of eix years, should be in a position to judge so to the advisability of granting the father's request for her discharge. The principal states in his letter that he does not agree with the statements of Resars.

Hellier and Binne that this girl is eighteen years of age and he also states that she is not sufficiently saveneed in her studies to receive her discharge.

The Department has, therefore, decided in the interests of this girl that she is to remain in the school for another year in order to complete her schoolses and training. You will be good enough to advise the parties concerned accordingly.
