- Q- Is there any doubt in your mind as to the identity of the N.C.O?
- A- No doubt at all, sir.
- Q- What happened to your right eye?
- A- I don't know, sir. That came out the day after, sir.
- Q- That is part of the injury?
- A- Yes, sir, part of the injury.
- Q- During the evening you had six beers?
- A- Yes, sir.
- Q- Over what period of time was that?
- A_ from about seven to nine-thirty, sir.

PRESIDENT :- Any questions you would like to ask

arising out of that?

DEFENDING OFFICER :- No, sir.

PROSECUTOR :- No. sir.

- ---- In the opinion of the Court, it is not necessary to comply with HP 83 (B).
- ---- The witness withdraws.

THIRD WITNESS FOR

PROSECUTION

Lieutenant R. W. INGLIS, A-10 C.I.T.C.,

C.A., being duly sworn, is examined by the

Prosecutor :-

- Q- What are your duties?
- A- I am a training officer in No.4 Company, A-10 C.I.T.C.
- What were you doing on the 1st-2nd March?
- A. I was the guard commander of A-10 at that time.
- What took place on that night?
- A- At about midnight I was called by one of the regimental police and told that a sergeant had struck one of the lance-corporal batmen....
