KINCARDINE, OR PENETANGORE.

An incorporated village in Bruce county, Ont., on Lake Huron, at the northern terminus of the southern extension of the Wellington, Grey and Bruce Railway, and at the northern terminus of the Toronto, Grey and Bruce Railway, 23 miles from Teeswater, 35 miles from Goderich. It contains a telegraph office, a branch bank, 2 printing offices, issuing weekly newspapers, 7 hotels, about 30 stores, large salt works, 2 iron foundries, a number of mills and workshops of various kinds, and has a large trade in grain and country produce.
