The Society was incorporated in 1872. Its expenditures in fourteen years amounted to about \$339,175. It received in donations over \$43,394; and it circulated publications to the value of over \$307,000. The publications circulated are mainly those of the Religious Tract Society of London and other non-denominational publishing houses. About \$66,660 have been spent in Colportage, and 130 years of labor were devoted to this object. Religious books, tracs, magazines, Sabbath schoal paners, libraries at half price, &c, are specialties of the Society's Depository. The operations of the Society are directed by an executive committee, which meets monthly, and by sub-committees on colportage, publications and finance.
