Our task is not to build more imposing structures, to attain to prouder standing among the forces of the world, but to enlarge the Kingdom of God by increasing the number of those who are filled with the Christ-life and who walk according to the Gospel of the Son of God. We must not be satisfied with any meretricious success. There is no success for the Church that is not represented by genuine Christian character and the fruits of the Spirit. May God grant that we may add to our numbers every year a half million, but let them be people who know Christ and the power of His resurrection. In the accomplishment of this great end I am persuaded that the Sunday School must play a great part; and I am confident that the two main lines along which the Sunday School will attain its greatest victories are the two which I have been endeavoring to define—the intelligent and thorough teaching of the Bible as the inspired Word of God, and the faithful spiritual preservation of the children of the Church, and their religious nurture and education."-John T.
