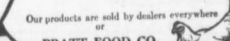

### ONTARIO.

HALIBURTON CO., ONT.

KINMONT, Nov. 25.—We have had a remarkably good day for the day, and to stop the plow for a day. Cattle are doing well on plenty of pasture. Fall plowing is being done. The continued wet weather low lands will not be touched. With the recent drop in price of cattle, several car loads left here. Hunters' season deer very scarce owing to the increase in the wolves. The Government should take steps to exterminate the wolves or the deer will be extinct in a short time. Last week a large number of turkeys changed hands, one firm paying \$1.00 Turkey, 1/2c; chickens, 16c; butter, 35c; eggs, 35c a doz.—J. A. S. T.

### OXFORD CO., ONT.

NEWBOTH, Nov. 25.—The potato crop of 1912 at one time promised one of the largest yields for a number of years. Very little blight and a strong growth of vines. Continued rains caused rot in nearly every instance on moderately heavy lands. Some lighter soils escaped. We can count on fully half lost with disease. I have been through Southern Ontario and find the same condition. Take from Bruce county to Toronto, the same prevalence; also in the counties of Brant, Halton, Oxford, on through to Essex. On a small Ontario farm was one of the best yields possible, but the proprietor said, "I am waiting to see if they will pay for digging." In other places I found a good crop without any decay; that is, in Muskoka and Parry Sound, which may help out a little. Muskoka and Parry Sound is suited to potato growing, and I should be followed largely for a profitable crop.—J. C. S.

### SIMCOE CO., ONT.

ELMVALE, Nov. 25.—The first fall of snow came on November 24; about three inches. Farmers have their fall work well along; almost all plowing is done and all hauled. Although a very wet fall yet the prolonged mild weather has been favorable for the closing season's work. Potatoes are much lower than last year. Hay, \$10; straw, 85c. Comparatively little grain is being sold of late years, mostly being fed. Potato rot reports are surprising.
