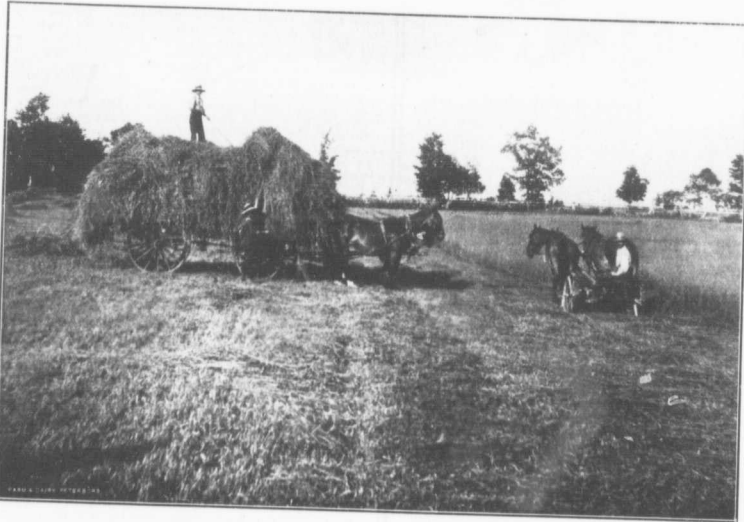

HARD AT WORK WITH THE TIMOTHY HAY IN PETERBORO CO., ONT.

Timothy hay, if it be of good feeding quality, should be cut shortly after it comes into bloom. It may weigh more heavily if allowed to more fully mature, but any gain in this way will be at the sacrifice of quality. On high-priced land, less and less timothy is being grown each year, its place being taken by clover. The illustration shows Mr. Jas. A.
