THE DEBT

The Committee appointed to deal with this matter presented their report at a meeting held for the purpose on February 18th, the report being, briefly, that an arrangement had been made with mortgagees to extend time for payment until the first of June next, when, upon \$30,000 being paid, the Cathedral Building and site should be discharged from the mortgage, leaving \$20,600 standing upon the school ground, to be dealt with during the year after that date. The report was adopted, and the Committee appointed, with additional names, as an Executive Committee to take further steps towards raising the required \$30,000. The Committee is now composed of Hon. S. H. Blake, W. R. Brock, E. B. Osler, M.P., E. M. Chadwick, J. A. Worrell, K.C., A. R. Boswell, K.C., W. H. Cross, Charles E. Clarke, R. L. Defries, Arthur Grasset, J. A. Kammerer, T. E. Moberly, W. Harley Smith, M.D., H. J. Wickham, W. H. Worden, with power to add to their number. Mr. Boswell is Treasurer of the Fund, and Mr. R. L. Defries, Secretary.

THE PAN-ANGLICAN CONFERENCE.

The present is an age of events; there have been more occurrences of world-wide importance during the past hundred years than in any other century of history since the beginning of the Christian Era, and so many wonderful things have been crowded into the past half century and follow one upon another so fast, that we have almost ceased to regard anything as marvellous, or indeed extraordinary. Just at the present time a movement has begun which, although it has received little attention from the newspapers and still less from many people who have a direct and personal interest in it, is a circumstance which we hope is leading up to an event without parallel or precedent. We refer to the proposed, or rather should say intended, offering to be presented at the Pan-Anglican Missionary Conference to be held in London in June next, an offering in which the whole Anglican Communion through the Empire is to unite, and in which the daughter Church of the United States is to have a part, and no doubt the infant Nippon Sei Ko Kwai or Japanese Church will also be represented; thus constituting one gift of probably colossal proportions from all parts of the earth. Our space will not admit of explanations or detailed information, all of which will no doubt be fully given out during the next few weeks. It is our part simply to say that St. Alban's Cathedral must not fail in its part in this extraordinary event. Whether we do much or little, let every one, old and young even to the youngest make his or her gift. Let no member of our congregation be obliged to confess that he was present and saw this great event take place but failed to have his personal part in it.

The subscriptions from the Women of St. Alban's Cathedral towards the Anglican Residence for Business Women, amounting to \$101, have been forwarded to Mrs. A. J. Broughall, by the Treasurer Mrs. Charles Clarke. The response to this appeal has been very gratifying, and thanks are due to those Ladies who collected the money.
