Major Bryan Cooper, a Protestant, and formerly a Unionist Member of the British Parliament, referred at a British Parliament, referred at a public meeting in Dublin to his experiences since he became a member of the Free State Parliament. For himself and those who were associated with him, Major Cooper went on, he could say that they could not have been treated with greater kindness or consideration by the other public men of the country.
