Cookery, Wood Carving, and Domestic Science.

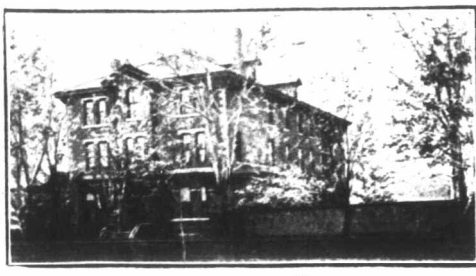
The Kindergarten will also re-open on

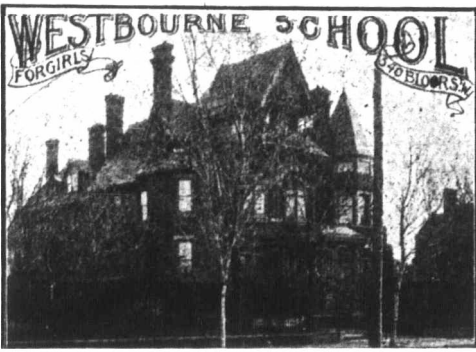
