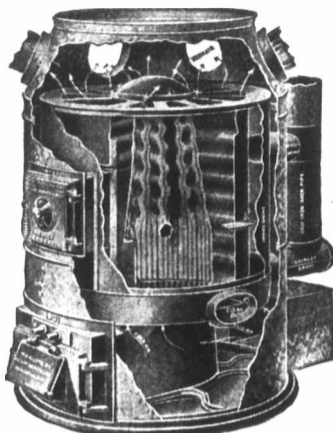
"How can we thank you, holy man?" exclaimed John Pengersek. "You have saved the life of our precious one. God bless you!"

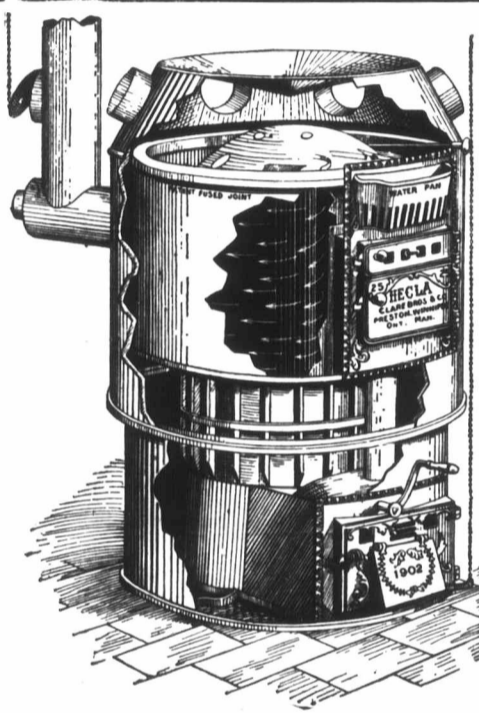
