#### LIVE STOCK MARKETS TORONTO.

With around 5000 cattle on sale Monday at the Union Yards trade generally as very dull, and the quality mostly inferior, tho some good loads were sold, as the prices will indicate. The arket generally was no higher than hovek, and some of the buyers were of the opinion that the better class of butchers were from 15 to 25c strong.

There was a fair inquiry for good and choice butcher cattle and breedy feeding cattle to go back to the country. Other classes were generally slow and lower. Ohoice butcher cows sold well, as there was a fair to good demand for this class of cattle.

Sheep and lambs-The lamb market made a quick come-back from last week, when the general price was 111c, and Monday sold a dollar higher, the bulk of the lambs selling at 121c a lb. They did not all tring that, but the bulk of the sales were made at that price.

The sheep market was up a dollar too, selling at \$8 for some of the handpicked lots, but there was a wide range on the sheep, according to quality, say from 61 to 7½c a lb, with the top at 8c. Heavy sheep sold from 51 to 6c.

Hog Prices-The hog prices of course held steady with last week, but the out look is for lower quotations for the balance of the tweek, the packer buyers quoting 17c to the farmer, 17tc f.o b., and 18tc fed and watered.
