Pritt Witthaus was cross-examined by former Judge Hoffman. In answer to the latter's questions, he said that he did not know the girl in the stomach which would not have caused death but there had been indications that there had been a much larger quantity in the stomach. He said he was sure that the girl might be safe in saying that the drug had caused death.

Other physicians testified that they believed Miss Foushter's death was caused by chloral hydrate. Detectives and policemen told of incriminating statements made by the girl at the time of his arrest. Mr. Connelley then submitted the case.
