**LEHIGH VALLEY REDUCES PASSENGER FARES.**

To take effect November 1st, or as soon thereafter as possible, the maximum rate per mile on the Lehigh Valley Railroad will be on the basis of 2 1-2c.

### TRAIN STRUCK THEM

A very serious accident occurred Saturday afternoon at the C. P. R. crossing at Lacroix St. A man, named Hugh McKegan, and a young boy, named Raleigh McKegan, were crossing the tracks going south when the 107 express, which was late, came along and ran into them. The man was driving a team attached to a wagon, the front of the engine struck the wagon and the occupants of the rig were thrown out.

Hugh McKegan, the man, got off with a few bruises and cuts on his face, but the boy, Raleigh McKegan, had both legs fractured and broken, one of them being a compound fracture. The train stopped and the young boy was taken to the freight shed, and Dr. J. P. Rutherford, the C. P. R. surgeon, was summoned. The man was able to go home, but the boy was taken to St. Joseph's Hospital. This morning he was doing as well as could be expected. At the time of the accident he was just getting over a severe attack of Typhoid fever, so that his constitution is not in the best of condition to fight a shock of this kind. The boy's home is on Colborne St. One of the horses was seriously injured in the accident, his leg being broken.
