

Death of Esteemed Lady

The death of Mrs. J. M. Card occurred at her home at Kentville on Saturday morning last after a brief illness. The deceased was a native of Hantsport, but for the past thirty-five years had been a resident of Billtown. She was a most estimable lady and was widely known for her hospitality and genial disposition. Mr. and Mrs. Card had sold their property at Billtown and removed to Kentville, where they had purchased a cozy little home and hoped to spend many happy days. Mrs. Card was busy making arrangements for a Christmas reunion of her large and scattered family when she was taken suddenly ill and passed away. She is survived by her sorrowing husband, six daughters and five sons, and a host of friends. She was twice married, her first husband being Nathan Taylor, of Falmouth, by whom she leaves two daughters, Mrs. B. O. Davidson, of Wolfville, and Mrs. S. M. Steadman, of Kentville. C. B. Card, musical director at the Lomis School, Windsor, Conn.; make up the surviving family.

The funeral was held on Tuesday afternoon from her late home, the remains being taken to Hantsport for interment. There was a very large attendance of sorrowing friends, many of whom came a considerable distance to pay their last homage of respect.

The service was conducted by Rev. Mr. Whitman, of Billtown, assisted by Rev. Mr. Ross, of Kentville. Two beautiful vocal solos were rendered by Mr. Charles Rockwell, of Lakeville, "The beautiful isle of somewhere" and "Some day we'll understand," the accompaniments being feelingly rendered by Mr. W. C. B. Card.
