flocks. There is one large flock in Alberta, near Calgary, owned by the Alberta Karakule-Arabia Sheep and Fur Co. Karakules have been bred in Canada since ;; The first importation of sheep. into America was made in 1908, and another small importation in 1913. Part of the second importation is on the ranch at Calgary.

As it is virtually impossible to procure these sheep from Asia, the laws being prohibitory, Canada has in the Karakule, an industry that in the near future will exceed the expectations of the nost optimistic.

There are many good reasons why Karakules are entitled to a prominent place in Canadian heep husbandry, and the following facts are of interest:
