The bill was agreed to.

The owners of the Tungsten mine on the Miramichi, York Co., were empowered to make a road two rods wide to enable them to ship their ore.

Time to complete the Valley Railway was extended.

The bill to refund the provincial and municipal indebtedness was agreed to.

House adjourned at 12.40.

June 22—The House met at 11.15 a. m.

The bill to amend the consolidated statutes, relating to the protection of sheep from dogs was agreed to.

The Bill to increase the taxes on Moving Picture Shows was withdrawn.

Prorogation

At three o'clock this afternoon His Honor Lieut-Governor Wood entered the assembly chamber and, after assenting to bills, prorogued the session with the following speech:

Mr. Speaker and gentlemen of the legislative assembly:

I thank you for the close attention which you have given to the general business of the session as well as those special subjects which I have from time to time submitted for your consideration.

Among the important legislation of the session I would direct attention to the act providing for a fund for the building of permanent highways, an act to provide for the refunding of the provincial and municipal indebtedness, an act respecting the compensation by employers for injuries to workmen, an act to consolidate the laws respecting the solemnization of marriages, an act in amendment of an act for the suppression of traffic in intoxicating liquors. I trust that these matters, together with the other legislation passed during this session, may be for the welfare and prosperity of the people of the province.

I thank you for the liberal provision you have made for the several important services of the province.

Before taking my leave I wish to refer very briefly to the one subject which at this time overshadows all others. Our Empire has been engaged for nearly three years in this great war for justice and humanity and each year we realize more fully the seriousness of the terrible struggle in which we are engaged. I desire to express my sympathy with the parents, relatives and friends of those whose lives have been sacrificed in the sacred cause and I sincerely trust that before long this great war will be brought to an end by victory for Great Britain and her allies and the causes for which they are fighting.

I congratulate you upon the conclusion of your arduous labors and take pleasure in relieving you from further attendance upon your legislative duties with my earnest prayers for your individual prosperity and happiness.

**SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS**

THE sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Application must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency), on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity.

Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre.

Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions.

A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre.

Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$300.
