DUKE OFFERS TO BET \$100,000 ON PIONEER. Huntingdon, L.I., Sept. 1.—Commodore Fred Burnham, chairman of the Duke of Devonshire's party, which will defend the International Cup against the British challengers next week, has received a cablegram from the Duke of Westminster, owner of the Pioneer, one of the challengers offering to wager any part of \$100,000 that the Pioneer will defeat the Duke.

LIVING COST INCREASING

Winnipeg is Troubled With Increased Cost of Necessities.

Winnipeg, Sept. 1.—The cost of living this summer and fall has been soaring so high that it is becoming a serious matter even for well-to-do householders. Meat has been extraordinarily high, eggs are at a record for this time of the year, butter is up in the air, everything is getting beyond the reach of ordinary mortals who are not in the millionaire class.

The latest blow is sugar, and that, necessarily, not to be outdone by other kitchen commodities, has been taking nation-wide notice. The advance announced, which is only the fourth already this month. Even the first of August the price of sugar had jumped from seven per ounce to ten pounds to \$8.95 and as far as local dealers know the end is not in sight. Up till today there has been an advance of forty cents per hundred and another advance which is announced from Toronto today will make it fifty cents.

When asked as to the probable cause of this advance in price, a local wholesale grocer could not place it definitely on anything. "The retailers do as they please," said he, hinting at market manipulation by sugar trusts, which some consumers blame for the rise.

SPAS TO TAX ALL VISITORS

Levy to Constitute Part of Plan to Develop Mineral Water Resources.

London, Aug. 29.—A special commission appointed by the French government to study the mineral water resources of the country, has recommended that a tax of four francs be levied on all visitors to the spas.

The tax is based on the rent paid by all visitors coming from the commune and remaining more than five hours at the spa. The tax is to be levied on all visitors, whether as relatives or servants, and is also liable.

Winnipeg, Man., Aug. 29.—Archbishop Langevin today made public an encyclical letter from Pope Pius X. The document is addressed to the Catholics of the Dominion and conveys the desire of His Holiness that differences of opinion among the faithful over race and lingual problems shall be prudently but persistently eradicated.
