

THE KINCARDINE SALT WORKS.—It is expected that this week's shipment of salt will amount to 4,000 barrels, besides 1,000 tons in bulk. The manufacturers have orders for all they can procure up to the close of navigation, and are quite unable to meet the excessive demand. All is for the United States market. The three blocks there are capable of turning out 357 barrels per day.
