THE RED SIGN

NOT PURSUIT OF
MASKED BANDITS

Trouble and Turmoil and
Lying About Near San Fran-
isco Over Some Robbers.

San Francisco, Cal., April 18.—Sher-
iff's deputies of two counties and a
company of volunteers on horses,
automobiles and in steel launches
were hunting over roads, hills and bay-
lands the masked bandits who held
the Alameda-Jarvis mail train on the
San Francisco Pacific near Benicia and
killed nine men and registered
the pursuit is warm and a bat-
tle is being fought in the hills or canyons
between Martinez and Oakland or at

cars. It is not definitely known, but

bandits is believed to be a matter of
time.

Interesting feature of the rob-

gers approached and opened fire on
them. The bandits seized Marsh
and Freeman and using them as
shields returned the fire, shooting over
their shoulders. Marsh said to the

Drowning of Canadian Woman.

St. Mich., April 18.—The body of
a woman found yesterday on
the shore of Grasse Lake, in the lower
river, was identified today as
Mrs. Arthur Best, formerly of
Ont. The finding of the body
corroborates the theory that
the woman seen floating on
ice off the foot of Wood-
bourne soon after midnight Sun-
day, March 15, was Mrs.
Arthur Best, who had married
a woman only a month pre-
viously. The identity of the
woman was taken into custody by the
police in the hope that he might clear
up the mystery of the identity of the
woman. But he declared that
on a ferry boat at the time
the woman was seen and that
he was not his wife. He was released
and sent to Canada. Efforts are now
made to locate him again.
