### REDUCED POSTAGE PROBABLE

An Ottawa despatch states that there is a strong possibility that Hon. W. S. Fielding, in his budget speech, will announce a return to the two-cent postage. The two-cent rate was put into effect by Hon. W. Mulock in 1897, and remained in effect, with increased postal revenues until the war, when it was increased to three cents for war purposes. Under the administration of Hon. Chas. Murphy, as postmaster-general, important economies were effected to such an extent that the postmaster-general himself announced at the recent postal conference that the return of the two-cent rate was in sight. The minister, however, intimated that it was for Mr. Fielding, as finance minister, to decide, inasmuch as the extra cent goes to the general consolidated revenue. There is a strong feeling in favor of the reduction, as being one which would affect practically every member of the population of the Dominion.

### TO STOP TREE BUTCHERY

The Ontario Department of Highways has made a first-class move in determining to stop tree butchery along public roads. Not only is it the intention to beautify the highways, but to preserve the existing beauty in that trees will not be mutilated or sacrificed wherever it is possible to save them. No company, telephone, power or telegraph, will be allowed to cut the trees without permission and only to remove branches which are entirely essential to transmission, will be given, and in any case only the minimum amount of tree pruning will be allowed, and such must be done under the supervision of the Department of Public Highways. In this connection various companies have entered heartily into co-operation with the department in that at present they are trying to clear their lines with as little mutilation as possible.

### DEATH OF PROMINENT LAWYER

William R. Meredith, one of the most prominent barristers of London, died suddenly at his home Monday, following a brief illness, aged 44 years. He was a son of the late Edmund Meredith K.C., many years one of the most successful criminal lawyers in Canada. In his younger days the deceased was an ardent lover of sports. His work as a lawyer was marked by a spirit of fair play. He practiced with his father for many years and since the latter's death, over a year ago, Mr. Meredith has been practicing alone, and it is believed that his demise was due in a large measure to the strain of overwork. In the last few years he had won many victories, and only last week had several cases at the spring assizes, and it was what was regarded as brilliant work. He is survived by two brothers and one sister, the latter residing with him.

Wm. Neil has purchased the farm of William Frank on concession 3, Alderburg.

Mr. and Mrs. Duncan B. McColl, of West Lorne, announce the engagement of their daughter, Sara Elizabeth, to Basil St. Clair McPherson, the marriage to take place early in April.

Neil Gray, of Rodney, and Chas. Popham, representing Shepherd & Co., of Port Stanley, were charged in the police court of having neglected to make reports to the fish overseer of the district the weight of each kind of fish caught in 1922 and the price per pound received. Gray was permitted to go on payment of costs, while a fine of \$5 and costs was imposed on Popham.

The death occurred at Byron Sanatorium on Saturday, after a lengthy illness, of Harry B. Riech, a prominent young barrister of St. Thomas. He was born in Southwold and graduated at Osgoode Hall two years ago. He saw much active service during the war, going overseas with the 91st Battalion. He was wounded before Amiens, and after being confined in three different hospitals received his discharge. He was solicitor for the M. C. R. in St. Thomas.
