In the south riding of Wentworth six meetings were held at Jerseyville, Ancaster, Mount Hope, Binbrook, Tapleytown, and Stoney Creek. The attendance was good, the people were on time, and each meeting started shortly after 2 o'clock, and Mr. Linfield, who has charge of this deputation, was kept talking till about 6 o'clock.

The deputation then moved forward into Lincoln county, holding meetings at Grimsby, Smithville, Beamsville, Campden, Jorden, Louth and Virgil. The weather during the work of the dairy in this county has been very wet, making it very difficult to get around, yet those in charge were always ready at the appointed time. One thing that is to be regretted is the lack of interest that is shown by those who are intrusted with the advertising in certain localities. Even when sent bills by the secretary of the institute these are not distributed in time nor spread over the area they should have covered.

The first four meetings in this county were not largely attended, but those who were there felt well repaid for their time and trouble.
