DONNYBROOK FAIR AGAIN

A GRATIFYING SUCCESS

Despite Unfavorable Weather, All

Enjoyed the Day.

Dorchester's Citizens Show Their

Loyalty to Their Annual Fair.

Donnybrook Fair, the annual fall

event which occupies so important a

place in the yearly history of the pros-

perous township of North Dorchester,

took place yesterday at the trim little

village of Dorchester Station, and the

favor of the fair. While it did not

rain, the skies were gloomy and the

afternoon was damp and chilly. The

effects of this was to decrease the at-

tendance somewhat, but it did not in

the least lessen the enjoyment of those

who were present. Dull skies and

chilly air availed little to dampen or

chill the spirits of those who were out

on a day of unalloyed pleasure. The

sturdy taking down of the matrons,

stalwart sons and the pretty daughters

of Dorchester were all out in force,

and their merry voices and smiling

faces betokened the enjoyment they

were taking down their day at

Dorchester's annual fair. Nor did the

city visitors, of whom there were be-

tween 300 and 400, differ from them in

this respect, for they, too, had aban-

doned themselves to the spirit of the

occasion, and were prepared to take

their full measure of amusement.
