Berlin, March 15. - An active trade in smuggled arms at Ostrowo, Prussia, and at Kalisch Russia, was broken up this week by the joint action of the Prussian and Russian police. The arms intercepted consisted chiefly of the poorest quality of revolvers, worth \$1 25 wholesale. There is no evidence that the smugglers were agents of revolutionists, or that they were connected with any organization. They were merely adventurous traders, who sell goods on the other side of the bor der at 400 or 600 per cent profit, with little risk on this side of the frontier although those caught in Russian ter ritory are severely punished. This il licit trade has always existed but i creased to large proportions during the recent months. Cheap revolvers are now abundant in any Polish city, but are becoming dearer farther in the interior.
