MAJOR WHITE, who, together with

Dr. L. S. Jameson, Col. H. F. White and Major Sir John Willoughby, was convicted of participation in the Transvaal raid into the Holloway Jail this morning, his term of seven months' imprisonment having expired. Major Willoughby, who was sentenced to ten months' imprisonment, is the only one of the raiders now in confinement. He has still three months to serve. Col. H. F. White and Col. R. Grey were liberated at the expiration of their five months' sentence on December 25, and Dr. Jameson, the leader of the raid, who was sentenced to fifteen months' imprisonment, was released on December 2nd on account of ill health. Captain Coventry received a sentence of five months' but was released in the latter part of August, 1896; the physicians of Holloway Jail certifying that further confinement would endanger his life, as he was suffering from the effect of a wound received in the fight between the raiders and the Boers at Krugersdorp on Dec. 31, 1895.

governments of Russia and Japan

of which both powers are to station a limited force of troops in Corea for the protection of Russian and Japanese settlements in that country. The signatory powers also agree to assist Corea financially and Russia undertakes to construct and maintain a line of telegraphic communication with Seoul, the Korean capital.

THE RUSSO-JAPANESE TREATY.

A Berlin despatch says:—The convention between Russia and Japan, the purpose of which is just made public, is ascertained to have been signed in Moscow by the late Prince Lobanoff, Russian Minister of Foreign Affairs, and the Count Yamagata, the Japanese envoy, on the occasion of the latter's visit to St. Petersburg in June last, as the representative of the Japanese nation at the ceremonies attending the coronation of the Czar. The tenor of the agreement has been known to the German Government for a long time, and it is possible that it was also known to the British Government. The treaty is certainly a slap in the face to England, which power Japan will oppose if Great Britain should attempt to seize Port Hamilton. By the terms of the convention Japan retains control of the telegraph lines in Corea with the exception of the line which the Russian Government is constructing to Seoul. The publication of the provisions of the convention is associated with a projected Korean loan, which will be guaranteed by Russia and Japan.

UNDESIRABLE A JOHANNESBURG.

A despatch from Johannesburg says that President Kruger and the chairman of the Volksraad, upon the promulgation of that body Saturday, made objection to the high court of appeal, but the Lord would not forsake his people. The chairman said that all attempts at compromise must be ended, and the law enforced in the letter. President Kruger said in his speech that if the storm which was brewing burst they would rely on God's help. The Government would enforce placing the high court in the control of the Volksraad, and all other laws exactly as they had been passed. The object of the enemies of the Transvaal was to efface the republic, but the Lord would not forsake his people. Other reports confirm the statement that great excitement prevails, and add that protests against the new high court law are being signed.

A SIGNIFICANT VISIT.

It is stated at Pretoria that President Kruger will shortly visit the Orange River and the purpose of the visit is to discuss with President Steyn and other officials a closer union between the two Republics. The visit is significant in view of the relations at present existing between the Transvaal and Great Britain.
