In Roumania the harvest is in full swing and, according to recent reliable reports, the damage done by the recent extraordinary weather is less than had been expected, although it will probably not equal last year's.

In the southwest of Russia, fine, hot weather has favored the harvest, and new samples of wheat and barley have been shown at Odessa much earlier than usual. The last four years' crops in Russia having exceeded the average it will not be surprising if this year's total yield in Russia should prove to be decidedly less than last year's.

This summary of the European crop outlook tends to confirm my estimate in last week's letter that the European wheat production may be at least 10 per cent below that of last year.
