Mrs. Yewmans, who was the mother of 11 children, lived on the most crodial relations with her family, and the only explanation of her rash act that can be given is that, while suffering from mental derangement, the result of a sunstroke sustained many years ago and from which she suffered periodically in hot weather ever since, she deliberately ended her life. Tuesday Mrs. Yewman performed her household duties as usual until noon. After dinner she entered the store and told her husband she was going for a short walk.

Tuesday afternoon Mr. Yewman came down town to hear the result of the elections. Finding upon his return home that his wife had not returned, Mr. Yewman concluded that she had called at her married daughter's and remained there over night. Yesterday, when she again failed to return, he became alarmed. Enquiry at the daughter's established the fact that she had not been there.

Identified the Body Last night Mr. Yewman's daughter called his attention to the fact that the body of a woman had been found in Humber Bay, and at 2 o'clock this morning, accompanied by a World reporter, Mr. Yew-man visited the Morgue and identified the corpse as that of his wife.
