DR. GULLEN DEFENDS HER CO-OPERATION WITH THE SCHOOL BOARD. Main Teachers Will Not Have Any Preference Over the Schoolmasters-The Poor Teachers to Be Given But One Vote in the Financial Statement.

The Public School Board met last night, but transacted very little business. The Executive Committee was absent and the meeting was adjourned early.

Dr. Noble gave notice of a motion which aims at weeding out the poor teachers from the city staff. He proposes to have the inspectors prepare a list of not less than 10 and not more than 20 of the lower grade teachers, who should be removed from the staff.

The old debate on the subject of male vs. female teachers was resumed once again when the same old resolution of the Board was taken up. The resolution was that the Board should employ male teachers in preference to female teachers.

Mrs. Dr. Gulden moved that the clause be struck, maintaining with the arguments she has frequently urged that female teachers are better qualified than male teachers to be in charge of the school.

The financial report of the school board was read and approved. The report shows a deficit of \$10,000 for the year ending in October.

Trustee Bell moved to have the kindergarten school connection with the Boys' Home abolished as there were only 16 pupils in attendance.
