

Zbyszko Defends "Rassle" Honors

Defeats Strangler Lewis in Two Falls Out of Three

NEW YORK, Nov. 28.—Stanislaus Zbyszko, of Poland, successfully defended the world's heavyweight wrestling championship at Madison Square Garden, to-night, defeating Ed "Strangler" Lewis, formerly of Lexington, Ky., now of San Jose, Cal. Zbyszko won two out of three falls. Lewis obtained the first fall with a flying headlock after 17 minutes and 51 seconds of wrestling.

Zbyszko had just escaped a dangerous hammerlock and regained his feet when Lewis grabbed him by the head and threw him over his shoulder and pinned the referee's decision and left the ring, but was induced by members of the State Athletic Commission to continue.

The champion won the third fall and match with a double armlock in 14 minutes and 46 seconds.

Before the match began it was announced that all holds, with the exception of the strangle-hold would be permitted.

Lewis weighed 237½ pounds and Zbyszko 223½.

The referee's decision in giving Zbyszko the second fall was loudly cheered by the spectators.

To-night's victory was the 94th for the champion in his 22 years of professional competition. He was defeated only once, the late Frank Gotch vanquishing him in a match that lasted but six seconds.

PETROLEA VOTE FAVORS BY-LAWS

Waterworks and Sugar Company Projects Are Successful

SUBSTANTIAL MAJORITIES

600-Ton Refinery to Be Built; Spend Much Money

PETROLEA, Nov. 28.—The waterworks by-law and the Peninsula Company Limited, by-law were endorsed by the citizens to-day by substantial majorities.

The waterworks by-law calls for the expenditure of \$40,000 for the installation of hydro-electric power, electrically driven pumps and the erection of a reservoir at the height of land. Petrolea has one of the most modern waterworks systems in Ontario. The present system was built over 20 years ago at a cost of \$185,000, furnishing the town with Lake Huron water from a distance of 16 miles.

The Peninsula Sugar Company, Limited, by-law endorsed an expenditure of \$27,000 for the purchasing of a site, the erection of a dam and dredging of a pond on Bear Creek, together with the building of a spur railway to the factory. The company in turn will erect a 600-ton sugar beet refinery, expending \$800,000 in plant and machinery.
