At the last two District meetings the Arkona Institute has advocated the appointment of a Decoration Day and the following resolution was present-ed by Mrs. Walker, Secretary of that Branch:-"Be it resolved, that we the members of the Arkona Women's Institute, desire to put ourselves on record as favoring the establishment by our government of a National Decoration Day, and that we strongly recommend that June 3rd, our King's birthday, be the date established.
