REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON COLLECTOR'S ROLLS

The Committee on Collectors' Rolls beg to report as follows:
 That the committee appointed last year dealt with each district separately and that we do not deem it necessary as we find by tabulated statement this year that arrears previous to 1897 are about the same, except in the District of Bay St. Lawrence, where \$105.25 of old arrears were collected.

We recommend that the collectors be notified by the treasurer to have all Collectors' Rolls in before the May meeting of Council, and in default of doing so they will be dealt with as the law directs.

We find that the collections of 1899 have been somewhat better, except in the districts of Baddeck and South Gut.

We strongly recommend that immediate steps be taken to collect all available arrears, particularly in the Districts of Baddeck and Ingonish.

REPORT OF COUNTY AUDITORS FOR YEAR ENDING DECEMBER 31ST. 1899.

We, the Auditors appointed by the Municipal Council of Victoria County to audit the books and accounts of the Treasurer of the said Municipality for the year ending December 31st 1899, beg leave to report as follows:

We have examined the Road and Bridges account and find that it shows a balance on hand of \$299.60.

We have also examined the License Inspector's account's which shows receipts, \$18.00; disbursements, \$64.13. There being a balance on hand from the year previous of \$130.96, we find now to the credit of this account \$84.83.
