WHEREAS, by Order of the Council of the 7th day of June, 1871, It is directed that sworn declarations and machinists' certificates be in all cases required preliminary to the admission free of duty, of machinery not manufactured in the Dominios for use in Canadian manufactures, and wher as, by the Act 87 Vic., chap. 6, the same machinery is made seject to an an valorem duty, of ten per cent., to take effect on the first day o January next, and whereas it is desirable to sinpilly the practice of the Customs in such cases,due regard being had to the Security of the revenue.

III Excellency the Governor General in Counell on the recommendation of the Hon.
