The new canal is prepared and plugged with iodoform gauze till its inner surface is covered with healthy granulations, and is then lined either by several single flaps which are kept in position by a tampon, or a lining is formed by sewing a number of flaps together round a Cusco speculum, and introduced with its wounded surface external into the granulating canal, and fixed by a tampon, which in either case is not removed for eight or ten days.—*Brit. Med. Jour.*
