

APPENDIX II

This appendix contains papers reflecting the results of work undertaken on issues in Clusters I, III and IV. They are enclosed to serve as a basis for future work.

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As regards the actual conduct of a challenge inspection it appears to the Commission that a conference of states has taken place on some aspects of the issue. These are collected in paragraphs 8-12 of Part II below. On other aspects related to the conduct of an inspection, delegations have given expression to quite different approaches. A number of questions have been raised in the search for a satisfactory problem-oriented description of these questions is also contained in Part II below. - 3/ Comment. The need for informing the President Council could be discussed. However, it appears logical that the recommending executive body of the Convention is informed about a development seen as a "rare event" and which implies an activation of the so-called "emergency" of the Convention.
- 4/ Comment. The time span of 24-48 hours from the request to the arrival of inspectors should be discussed.
- 5/ Comment. Situations could be envisaged, i.e. when the site to be inspected is not in the territory of the requesting state party. Such cases could however be considered in the context of questions related to jurisdiction.
