Tariff Impacts of Free Trade

U.S. tariffs on oils and greases from mineral oils are calculated by volume, weight, value or a combination of weight and value. Greases carry duties of 5.8% or 1.3 cents/kg plus 5.7%. Tariffs by volume on oils range from 10.25 cents/bbl to 52.5 cents/bbl. Under the Free Trade Agreement, these items become duty free by January 1, 1993, with five equal stages of tariff reductions.

Tariff Impacts of Free Trade

U.S. tariffs on manufactured iron or steel ranged from 0.3% to 10%. Under the Free Trade Agreement, certain tariffs will be removed by January 1, 1993, in five equal stages and others by January 1, 1998, in ten equal stages.
