CANADIAN COMMITTEE ON OCEANOGRAPHY

Question No. 1,705—**Mr. Forrestall:**

1. Is the Canadian Committee on Oceanography still charged with the responsibility of the co-ordination of activities in marine science and technology?

2. Was this the description of the mandate of the Committee given by the Minister of State for Science and Technology in a news release dated July 12, 1973, entitled "New Oceans Policy"?

3. With reference to the answer to Question No. 1,329 which stated that "the Canadian Committee on Oceanography has not met within the last six months", who now has the responsibility of co-ordinating the activities in marine science and technology and on what date was the change, if any, affected?

4. Does this Committee intend to meet within the next six months and, if not, for what reason?

5. Is it the intention of the Minister to in any way alter the parameters and outlines of the government policy on oceans from those presented July 12, 1973 and, if so, on what date?

6. What is the assessment of government of the value of the Canadian Committee on Oceanography and of the role of the Ministry of State for Science and Technology in Oceans Policy?

Hon. C. M. Drury (Minister of State for Science and Technology): 1. Yes

3. The Canadian Committee on Oceanography has met since Question 1,329 was answered, that meeting occurring on June 10, 1975. No changes have been made with regard to co-ordination of activities in marine science and technology.

4. The Canadian Committee on Oceanography intends to meet within the next six months.

5. The Minister of State for Science and Technology has no specific intentions of altering the parameters and outlines of this government policy on oceans from those announced on July 12, 1973; in his responsibility for conducting a continuing review of ocean policy, the Minister will recommend changes in that policy to Cabinet when the need arises.

6. In the view of the government, the Canadian Committee on Oceanography is fulfilling a valuable role in reviewing and advising on activities in marine science and technology. The government also considers that the Ministry of State for Science and Technology has performed, and continues to perform, an essential role in the development of the Oceans Policy and in the continuous review of issues related to this policy.
