UNIVERSITY STUDENT FEES

Question No. 2,655—Mr. Herbert:

1. Does the government record the level of student fees at universities?
2. Does the Canada student loans program provide assistance to university students adversely affected by preferences in provincial funding programs?

Hon. Gerald Regan (Secretary of State): 1. Statistics Canada publishes an annual booklet entitled "Tuition and Living Accommodation Costs at Canadian Universities" (Catalogue No. 81-219) which sets out the level of student fees at universities.

2. The maximum loan limits under the Canada Student Loans Act apply to all Canadian students who can establish a need for financial assistance. While the level of provincial funding, and hence the amount of Canada student loan element in the aid package, varies, all provinces, with the exception of Québec which has opted out of the program since its inception, provide Canada student loan aid to the maximum permitted by the act where the need for such aid is established.

PURCHASE OF FEED PELLETS

Question No. 2,688—Mr. Stewart:

Did the Department of Regional Economic Expansion purchase feed pellets valued at \$16,000 from Federated Co-operative Ltd., Brandon and, if so, for what purpose?

Hon. J.-J. Blais (Minister of Supply and Services): A contract in the amount of \$16,000, was awarded by the Department of Supply and Services, on behalf of the Department of Regional Economic Expansion, to Federated Co-operative Ltd., Brandon, Manitoba for the supply of "bull feed" pellets to be used to feed cattle at the St. Lazare Bull Station, seven miles north of McAuley, Manitoba.

BABCOCK MOTOR BODIES LTD.

Question No. 2,705—Mr. McKinnon:

Was a contract let to Babcock Motor Bodies Limited, Toronto for \$812,851, for "vehicular furniture and accessories" and, if so, what is the furniture and what are the accessories?

Hon. J.-J. Blais (Minister of Supply and Services): Yes, a contract was awarded by the Department of Supply and Services, on behalf of the Department of National Defence, to Babcock Motor Bodies Limited, Toronto, Ontario, for \$812,851, for the fitting of "vehicular furniture and accessories" which comprise of the following:

- (a) Pintle hooks (accessories)
- (b) Metal superstructures and tarpaulins (accessories)
- (c) Aluminum caps (accessories)
- (d) Removable fold-down bench seats (furniture)
- (e) Winches (accessories)
- (f) Undercoating (accessories)

A total of 353 DND vehicles are being fitted in various configurations with the above items.

Mr. Smith: I ask, Madam Speaker, that the remaining questions be allowed to stand.

Madam Speaker: Shall the remaining questions stand?

Mr. McKinnon: As you know, Madam Speaker, I seldom rise at this time to question the abilities of the parliamentary secretary. However, I have asked a couple of questions on forces' aircraft being used for the transporting of cabinet ministers and others. One has been on the Order Paper since January 27 and the other since May 21. The question of January 27 asks the cost of the Prime Minister's trip when he got lost in Austria, and the second question is regarding the number of times the Falcon jets have been used.

I do not know what the policy of this government is about the costing of aircraft trips, but on the other question, I was surprised to see the answer to a question by the hon. member for Leeds which was tabled in this House on October 16. The answer to question No. 1,996 indicated:

The list of executive aircraft used by cabinet ministers, as approved by the Minister of National Defence, in accordance with the guidelines outlined in question No. 169, will be available on a monthly basis effective October, 1981 (on request).

It is now October 1981. My requests are in question No. 2,035 on January 27, and question No. 2,519 on May 21. When will I receive my answers?
