

The several motions, if made, shall have preference in the order above stated, and the first, second, or third thereof shall be decided without debate.

V.—Any member may require the division of a question when the same may admit of it.

VI.—The Yeas and Nays shall be taken and recorded, on the call of any member, duly seconded.

VII. Every member shall have the privilege of speaking twice on any question, but not oftener, unless by permission of the Master.

VIII.—Any brother intending to speak on a question shall rise in his place, and respectfully address the Chair, confining himself to the question, and avoiding personalities; at the same time giving the sign under which the Lodge is working; and should more than one brother rise at the same time, the Master shall determine which is entitled to the floor.

IX.—Any member who shall so far forget the respect due to himself and the member of the Lodge, as to appear at any meeting in a state of inebriety, or in indecent apparel, or who by any improper conduct shall disturb the peace and harmony of the Lodge, or who shall not obey the gavel of the Master when called to order, shall for the first offence be admonished by the Master; for the second be compelled to withdraw from the room for the evening; and should he for the third time be guilty of a similar offence, he shall be suspended, until he in open Lodge make proper acknowledgement of the fault, and promise amendment.
