

Barracks in Ireland; and also to annul the various powers which have been granted from time to time for the Management and Regulation of Barracks in all Our Colonies and Garrisons Abroad (New South Wales and the Island of Ceylon excepted); and to transfer the Charge and Management of all Barracks erected, or to be erected, for the general service of the Army in Great Britain and Ireland, the Channel Islands, and the Isle of Man, and in all Our Colonies and Garrisons Abroad (except New South Wales and the Island of Ceylon, at the former of which the Ordnance have not at present any Establishment, and at the latter the Barracks have heretofore been under the Management of the Colonial Government,) from the said Comptroller of Barracks; the Commissioner of the Barrack Board and Board of Works, and all other persons in whom the same were vested—to You and Our Board of Ordnance, or to Our Master-General and Board of Ordnance for the time being, who shall in future undertake the entire superintendence of all matters relative to the Barracks of Our Army within
