COOKSHIRE.

The church in this mission, the corner stone of which was laid by the Lord Bishop of Quebec, in 1868, has just been completed. Amount raised will fall short of last year by \$300.

DRUMMONDVILLE.

The Rector of Drummondville reports financial depression and cessation of public works, but is cheered by the arrival of some capitalists from Scotland, who are about to start a spool factory. The sum of \$125.00 appears less than last year.

DURHAM.

This mission shows a deficit in the aggregate of moneys collected last year of \$693.25. The amount, however, to outside objects is double what it was last year. A pleasing feature of this report is that it embraces a contribution from each station to eight different objects of the Church's work outside the mission.

HATLEY AND WATERVILLE.

The difficulty of keeping up Sunday schools in winter has induced the Incumbent to adopt the good old usage of catechising after the second lesson. He speaks of this as an experiment, and with some hope.

Three full services are kept up in this mission during the year. The collection for all church purposes falls short of last year by \$27.79.
