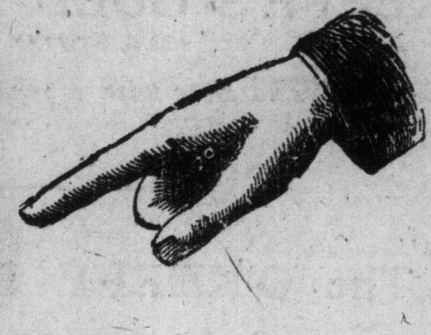

## PECULIAR CASTES AMONG WHITE ANTS

The various castes of social insects have different appearance, but it has been supposed that they are alike on leaving the eggs and develop their peculiar characteristics artificially through differences in feeding or the action of parasites. Seeking to learn when the different forms of termites, or white ants, begin, Professor Bugnion, of Paris, concludes that this theory is wrong. Among the several castes of this insect, the soldiers, the workers, the mandibles, and the workers, which build and bring food, have a distinct form, but neither reproduce. The caste known as reproductives, on the other hand, with a special development, appear to perform no part except perpetuating the species. The investigation made with a number of species shows that the peculiarities of form exist in newly hatched insects, and that, therefore, division into castes, like that of the bees, takes place before the larvae are born.
