Enthusiasm broke loose in Aurora when the result was known, bands and torch-bearers parading the streets, and when Mr. Lennox arrived at Newmarket after the election a procession was lined up in his honor, and he addressed the electors in the market square.

Yesterday the riding of East York again expressed its complete confidence in Sir James Whitney's government and its representative in the provincial legislature last session, George S. Henry, by returning him to office with the substantial majority of about 800.

Mr. Henry received big majorities in York Township and Ward One, his opponent, Mr. Bruce, being soundly defeated in both.
