not intermarried, and of there being any issue born to him of such subsequent marriage, the said issue so born shall be and the same are hereby declared to be to all intents and purposes legitimate, and the right of them, the said issue, and each of them, and their respective heirs, as respects their 5 and each of their capacity to inherit, have, hold, enjoy and transmit all and all manner of property, real or personal, of any nature or kind whatsoever from any person or persons whomsoever, shall be and remain the same as they would have been, to all intents and purposes whatsoever, if the 10 marriage between the said Andrew Maxwell Irving and Marie Louise Irving had not been solemnized.
