

TRIBUTES OF RESPECT TO LATE REV. DR. TEEFY

Thousands Viewed Remains of
Priest in St. Basil's Church
—Impressive Services.

Hundreds assembled in St. Basil's church yesterday morning to pay their last respects to the late Rev. Dr. Teefy. The Requiem mass was sung by Rev. Father Marlow, assisted by Rev. Father Walsh as deacon, Rev. Father Murphy, sub-deacon, and Rev. Father Kelly, master of ceremonies.

The body of the dead priest lay in state just outside the altar rails and before the service began was viewed by many thousands of people.

After the beautiful chant of the Requiem mass, the Rev. Dr. Teefy was pronounced an eloquent eulogy upon the deceased clergyman. He said he was not only a great priest, but a great teacher, a devoted pastor and a saintly man. The eulogy was a beautiful tribute to the life and work of the late priest.

The funeral services were held at St. Basil's church at 10 o'clock yesterday morning. The Rev. Dr. Teefy was interred in the St. Basil's cemetery.
