**STRAWBERRY PRICES DROP**

Fruit was a little more plentiful yesterday—Green Corn Arrived From the South.

Strawberries are still quite plentiful on Toronto fruit market; two loads arrived yesterday, one in the morning, one in the afternoon. The price dropped a couple of cents below yesterday's quotations, varying between 11 and 13 cents a box.

This morning at 9:30 a car of fruit will be auctioned off by White & Co.; the car contains peaches, plums and a few pears. Bushel baskets of peaches are now arriving from Texas. They bring from \$2.25 to \$2.75 a basket. Texas tomatoes are also on the market, selling at 41 cents a crate.

Green corn has begun to arrive from the Southern States. A car load came in yesterday. Crates of cabbage from the south are also on sale. There are no American apples on the Toronto

market at present, but another shipment is expected soon.

Fruit prices as quoted are as follows: Strawberries, 12c to 15c a box; Malaga grapes, \$3.50 to \$4 a case; Canadian cherries, \$1.50 to \$2.25 a case; Texas cherries, 75c to \$1 a bushel; cantaloupes, \$2.25 to \$2.75 a bushel; cantaloupes, \$5 a case; California plums, \$2 to \$2.50 a case; bananas, \$1.75 to \$2 a bunch; oranges, \$2.50 to \$4.50 a crate; lemons, \$3.25 to \$5 a crate; pineapples, \$8 a crate; California apricots, \$1.75 a case; green corn, \$2 a crate; cabbage, \$2.50 a crate; Texas tomatoes, \$1 a crate.
