Nearly a Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars Passed For Use by Commissioner Harris.

TO COMPLETE BUILDING

Asphalt Pavement, Quarry and Gravel Pit Included in Equipment Necessary For Toronto.

Reid construction and repair, \$46,800. Street construction and repair, \$25,350. Asphalt plant, \$30,000. Quarry and gravel pit, \$25,000. Total expenditure, \$147,420.

The above represents the sum passed by the board of works yesterday at its meeting at the city hall, and which is a request made by Works Commissioner Harris towards helping him out with the many items in the matter of road and sewer construction now held up on account of insufficient plant.

The commissioner has already stated that he cannot complete Wilton avenue bridge because he has not enough steam rollers to complete more important work before the winter sets in. Ericsson is in a worse condition than many country districts. The bridge there are a continual source of complaint from deputations to the city hall.

The extensive work carried on at the Exhibition this summer was a sore task on the present plant belonging to the works department and important work throughout the city would only be recommenced on account of the rush of work in Exhibition Park.

Unless the plant be obtained forthwith, the newly annexed districts cannot be considered as parts of the city in so far as the usefulness is concerned, as it would be useless for him to take on work on the extra fifty-five miles of unimproved streets in the North Toronto and Moore Park areas without the means of carrying it out.
