Liverpool wheat futures closed today 1/4 to 1/2 higher than yesterday and corn futures 1/4 to 1/2 higher.

At Chicago July wheat closed 1/2 lower than yesterday; July corn 1/2 lower and July oats unchanged.

Chicago car lots to-day wheat 45, corn 25, oats 20.

Primary receipts to-day: wheat 40,000, corn 30,000, oats 10,000. Total receipts to-day 80,000. Year ago 1,000,000, 1,000,000, 1,000,000.
