A distinguished visitor in the person of Hon. Masana Mayeda of Tokio, Japan, arrived in the city yesterday from Ottawa, where he had been interviewing the Government in regard to the futherance of trade between this country and Japan, and a better understanding as to the treatment of his country. Mr. Mayeda is perhaps one of the most influential members of the House of Lords of the Imperial Japanese Diet, having been working for the 'advancement of Japanese commerce and industry for the past 39 years.

In speaking of his visit to this city, Mr. Mayeda said that he merely amehere to see and study for himself what his countrymen are doing here, and how they might become useful to Canada. The same manner as the Chinese is another cause for his visit, Mr. Mayeda gasys the two peoples are entirely different in their characteristics, the Chinese coming here to make money enough to take them back to their native land, while on the other hand the Japanese are a prodigal people. Many of them amass wealth, but they spend it in extravagance. He believes that the Japanese laborer will be of great service to this country, and intends to see that none but the right people are allowed to settle in Canada.
