Jury Sent to the Scene.

At 2 o'clock court re-opened, and Mr. A. E. Poirier, counsel for the defence, asked that the jury be sent to St. Canute to visit the seene where the murder was committed. With the cohsent of Mr. F. X. Mathieu, the Crown prosecutor, this demand was granted.

Two special constables were appointed, and under the direction of High Constable Brazeau, they started for St. Canute at 2.30 and the large crowd which had assembled dispersed. At 4.30 the jury returned and were locked/up for the night, the court having adjourned until to-morrow at 10 a.m. It is probable Detective McCaskili will be the first witness called by the Crown at the opening of the court to-morrow morning.
