## WEST INDIES MAY JOIN US

Prominent Merchant of St. Kitts Writes Favoring Confederation With the Dominion.

## TRADE COMMISSIONER TO LONDON

Canadian Manufacturers' Association Will Confer With Committee of Board of Trade.

The Special Committee of the Toronto Executive of the Canadian Manufacturers' Association, to consider the appointment of a special trade commissioner to London, met yesterday afternoon. It was decided to confer with a committee of the Board of Trade, appointed for the same purpose. The conference will be held some time this week.

A letter was received by Secretary Young from the assistant secretary, J. M. Stewart, who is in the West Indies. Mr. Stewart encloses a letter received from a prominent merchant of the island of St. Kitts, who favors the West Indies becoming a part of the Dominion of Canada. The writer also suggests the establishment of a political organization between the islands and Canada, as well as a commercial tie.



## ARGUMENT IN BICYCLE CASE

Markham Township Farmer Arraigned in County Police Court on a Serious Charge.

The Civil Assizes for the trial of jury cases were resumed yesterday afternoon. Mr. Justice Meredith presiding. A settlement was arranged in the suit of E. J. Kromberg against the Canada Cycle and Motor Company. Jane Jameson sued the Schomberg & Aurora Railway Company to recover damages and to obtain an injunction because it was claimed the company had, in grading their road, converted to their use part of her lot, No. 25, on the fifth concession of King Township. The company agreed to replace certain shade trees and pay \$150, which arrangement proved satisfactory to the plaintiff. The action was therefore dismissed without costs.

Judge Meredith dismissed the suit of the Cowan, Ramsay Company against Fitzgerald, Scudamore and Company, London, and R. Carie and Company, Toronto. The question on which the court was called upon to pass judgment was whether the defendants were authorized to deliver warehouse receipts for 345 packages of tea.
